But he quarreled with his sometime ally and colleague, Cardinal Richelieu, and both his career and his reputation suffered undeserved eclipse. Nonetheless, with his help, his niece Louise de Marillac overcame disadvantageous origins and went on to serve her faith and society with great distinction. Come join an exploration of the family background of these two remarkable individuals.
